The word “job” sounds like something that is drudgery and even, at times, boring. Some prefer to call what they are doing “ministry”. This also can become hard and boring even though it sounds as if it is a higher calling.

There are several jobs I have done over the years; some boring but the majority have been very rewarding. One of the latest is serving on the Administrative Council as Care Coordinator. I was given a manual of sorts – a brief job description. In that position I represent many faithful men and women who serve in various capacities to meet the needs of our congregation. Benevolence Fund, Meals, Visitation, Fellowship Feast Lunches, Funeral Lunches, Showers, Kitchen, Wellness, Newcomers. Most of the men and women on these Teams work behind the scenes. They do the work; I just report on what they are doing.

Let me tell you about some

other jobs that are near and dear to my heart at this point in my life.

I am a wife. That job did not come with a manual. Forty six years ago, however, I had my own ideas and I believed John would meet all my needs and we would live happily ever after. I soon found out that's not the way it works and there were some job requirements on my part. There have been some unexpected things pop up but looking back I can see how God has been faithful in seeing us through them.

39 years ago I became a Mother. That job did not come with a manual either. We learned by doing; being the best parents we knew how to be. Sometimes it worked; sometimes it didn't. But we have a daughter who has brought us much joy.

I'm a grandmother. Who needs a manual? You just tell them about Jesus whenever you get the opportunity, love on them all the time, visit them as often as possible, take all

the pictures you can, brag on them to everyone you see whether they ask or not and make as many memories as possible!

I'm a Christian. I have the best manual there is – the Bible. This is my most important job. I always knew I was God's creation but I was 33 years old before I became His child. My Manual tells me to hide God's Word in my heart. I have to read it in order to do that and that requires me to be in it every day. It also involves Bible Studies, fellowshiping with other Christians, communicating with God on a daily basis through prayer, worshiping on Sundays and attending an ABF class.

What's your job? The same as mine – “And now what does the Lord your God ask of you but to fear the Lord your God, to walk in all His ways, to love Him, to serve the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul, and to observe the Lord's commands and decrees that He has given you for your own good.” Deuteronomy 10:12-13. ☞

God is so good to us each and every day, and all too often we take this goodness for granted. Not giving God the credit for the blessings in our lives is one of the greatest sins that we suffer from, and I know too well that I fail in this area of my life all too often. If you are like me, reflective meditation and quiet thought are not necessarily your strong suits, and I often envy those people who we affectionately refer to as “prayer warriors”; those who truly meet the call to pray unceasingly. However, even with my shortcomings, God has been faithful to one of my most frequent prayers. I know my heart, and just how unrighteous I can be, so I continually ask God to “hold on to me”. I know that it is not by anything that I have done to earn my salvation, and in fact it is despite anything I have done that God has saved me. I pray constantly a prayer of gratitude for this gift that God has given to me, for truly “...not that we

Finally, I have to give God

credit for my wife. I never “felt empty” or minded being single, but there was an indescribable sense that there was more I could accomplish, and I needed a partner in order to do that. For anyone who has ever looked over the demographics of GEFC, you can appreciate that there is not an abundance of single people in their twenties and thirties, so if I was going to find a Godly wife, she would certainly have to come from some means outside our church...WRONG. I have been richly blessed with a loving, God fearing wife straight from the Reiling family.

I encourage you all to reflect on the blessings and answered prayers in your lives. Once you sit down and really think about the blessings that God lavished on you, and even more specifically, the prayers that He has answered, you are forced to recognize what an awesome God we serve.

Ruth's doing as well as can be expected. We've already had tons of visitors and praise God that our parents are here. Is God calling you to help these women?

Hold to the Center by Michael Mauriello, Youth Pastor

Jon Meacham of Newsweek wrote a controversial article where he contends that American Christianity is slowly dying. Is he right? American Christianity may not be dying, but it is in an identity crisis. In the wake of the trauma of the Enlightenment, the Industrial Revolution, the Sexual Revolution, Modernism and Postmodernism, and the pop culture revolution, American Christianity has struggled for identity for at least a century. But in the Southern Hemisphere, in Africa, South America, and in the 10-40 Window, Christianity is exploding with a clear sense of identity!

What is the difference? There are two things. Number One, the Southern church is defined by the gospel, and the gospel alone! Number Two, it is a matter of the particular threat Satan has attacked us with. It's a difference between two different assaults on the gospel and the church. The first is persecution, the other is prosperity. When the church is persecuted, it always thrives. When the church is established, and threatened by wealth and

security, it tends to die.

Many scholars would argue that without Christianity, there is no middle class, no American form of republicanism, no capitalism, etc. They are right. Christianity propped up, vigorously re-imagined, or invented many of the social institutions that we take for granted today. Foremost among them would be our educational system. Without Christianity, we would not have the university system that we have in place today. But when we divorce social institutions from the gospel from which they sprung, we get disenchanted teachers and bored students. Education is no longer about exploring God's universe and learning to love neighbors and enemies, it takes a plunge into getting ahead to get a decent job.

Over the last 150 years, America's Christian worldview has been eroded. And I think so has the churches. What does the American church center itself around? I was reading in Philippians and Ephesians this past week, and I was struck by how the gospel is vigorously attached to every aspect of

our worldview; our understanding of the invisible realm of angels and demons, our understanding of social impact, our understanding of family, our understanding of government and submission of government, our understanding of calling and direction.

So, why are so many men and students bored with church? I think two things: we have forgotten the gospel, and we have fallen into the trap prosperity brings. The gospel is a daring message—it was driven by young men for almost its entire history, poor young men ready to sacrifice everything. But when wealth gets into our hearts, however subtly, our center, and our zeal, disappear.

The gospel gives two pieces of advice to its two largest challengers. To the tried and persecuted, endure. To those tempted by prosperity: hold to the center, to the gospel itself, and the gospel alone! What holds the center in our lives? It's a matter of life and death for our own spiritual lives, and the life of our national church movement. ☞

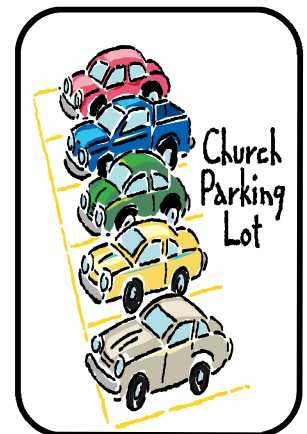

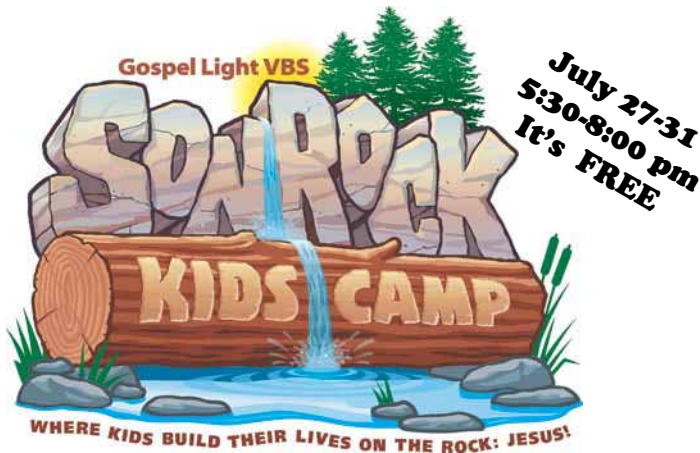
